At the Solidarity Economy Association, we believe we need a transformation away from capitalism towards an economy that puts people and the planet first. We're supporting the growth of an economy that embodies environmental and social justice, diversity and pluralism, co-operation, self-management and ecological sustainability – a solidarity economy.

### **ABOUT THE ROLE**

We're looking for a developer to work on Mapping the Solidarity Economy – a significant project that uses cutting edge Linked Open Data technology to help groups around the UK map their communities locally. We also work with national and international membership organisations who share our values to help them publish information about their organisational members.

You'll be an experienced web developer who's comfortable leading on the map functionality for this project, as well as providing general web development and support to the team. You'll have a proactive approach and will be responsible for researching, developing and documenting new features, testing on multiple devices, maintaining several digital map instances and other related tasks.

SEA operates in a non-hierarchical way, and, as part of a small team, you'll have a lot of autonomy, so it's important that you feel comfortable in that position. Your main point of contact will be the Open Data and Mapping Technical Lead, who is based in Oxford. You'll work closely with other members of the team.

## **ABOUT THE PROJECT**

The UK has thriving networks of solidarity economy initiatives - informal meetings, grassroots organisations, and local community groups, through to legally-recognised businesses, associations and networks of organisations who all share a set of values - and we believe that by mapping these diverse networks, the movement as a whole will be stronger. - Familiarity and/or interest in new/alternative economics would also be an advantage.

We are initially looking for someone to work 3 days per week for 3 months. This could grow into a full time role, depending on the success of the next phase of the project.
